Annual Geneva 2030 Summit: Shaping Our Shared Commitment to Geneva's Youth

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The annual Geneva 2030 Summit was held recently at the Bozzuto Center, and included representatives from the organization's executive board, advisory board, and six action teams. Close to 50 attendees gathered to review data, discuss strategy, and learn more about the StriveTogether network. This annual event brought together thought leaders from across Geneva to address pressing challenges and opportunities, envisioning ways to harness our collective interest and commitment to the 'cradle to career' success of Geneva's youth.

The summit's highlight was a keynote address by a Geneva native Christie Smith, Associate Vice President of Undergraduate Enrollment at Nazareth University, who spoke about her experience as a child enrolled at Geneva Head Start, acknowledging exceptional teachers she had throughout her time in GCSD schools, and highlighting her family's involvement in her success. "I'm going to challenge all of you to dig deep, to push back, and to challenge the broken systems that exist within this community—because they do" she noted, and received a standing ovation at the conclusion her remarks. GCSD Superintendent Bo Wright also engaged participants in the district priorities, "safe, positive learning environments, academic achievement, and equity and inclusion."
