Leader in Training: We offer a 2 week leadership training program led by one of our veteran summer program directors. LIT campers will have an opportunity to see "behind the curtain" and learn how camp runs on a day to day basis. Campers will also have an opportunity to lead some activities and try out some of the new leadership skills they learn.

Trip Camp: In August of 2026 we are offering a Level 1 & Level 2 trip camp to the southwest corner of the Adirondack Park. The Level 1 group will be a beginner group getting their first taste of the Adirondack outdoor living experience. They will stay at a base camp in a lean-to or platform tent. They

will take day trips hiking to a fire tower, canoeing the Beaver River and participating in a high ropes course session. Level 2 campers will be more experienced in outdoor living and spend 3 days on the Beaver River participating in an extended canoe trip. Level 2 campers will learn how to properly navigate on the river, how to set up camp with minimal environmental impact, how to manage supplies and daily living in the wilderness, and of course fishing (and maybe catching dinner!)

About: Camp Whitman on Seneca Lake, Inc was established in 1954 with a historic connection to the Presbyterian Church, USA (PCUSA). The camp was recently incorporated as a 501c3 non-profit organization and maintains a membership in the Presbyterian Church Camp & Conference Association. Our summer camp program is modeled after the teachings of Fred Rogers of Mr. Roger's Neighborhood. Mr. Roger's was a Presbyterian minister, and many of his lessons focused on how to be a good neighbor. The same is true for Camp Whitman. Any faith formation lessons that we provide show us how to care well for one another and for the natural world around us. That is the most important faith lesson we can learn. As we enjoy lake time, campfires, swimming, games, and friendship building, we encourage campers to "see" one another as we live together in the temporary community of camp.

Ontario County Youth Court

A restorative diversion that gives youth (grades 7-12) the opportunity to learn about the criminal justice system, be trained in the roles of the courtroom (judge, jury, prosecution, defense and bailiff) and then assume those roles in real court cases for youth offenders (respondents). Youth Court members review the case information, listen to witness testimony from the respondent and their

families, and then work together to assign sanctions to the respondent that are restorative, not punitive. These sanctions are meant to help heal any damage or hurt that was caused by the crime that was committed and help the respondent rebuild positive connections within the community. To become a member of Ontario County Youth Court, youth must attend a 20 hour training course.
